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


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

DNV Stroke Survey Recap

Surveyors with DNV were on-site at Piedmont Columbus Regional on August 4 for a comprehensive review of the stroke service line. This was Columbus' first stroke survey with DNV as we transition from Joint Commission.

Three onsite surveyors toured five departments — meeting with staff and doing an in-depth medical records review to look for consistency in patient charting and log management. We had three stroke alerts in a matter of 20 minutes; DNV paused the survey to observe how our team springs into action to care for our patients. Once finalized, the accreditation will last for 3 years with on-site reviews annually.

Piedmont Columbus Regional is the leader in stroke care for the Chattahoochee Valley area. We'll soon be just one of only two DNV-accredited Primary Plus Stroke Centers in the state of Georgia! We're also one of ten hospitals in the state of Georgia that are able to perform stroke thrombectomy procedures.

Urgent Care Centers Transition to WellStreet

The two Piedmont Urgent Care (PUC) Centers in Columbus have transitioned to Piedmont's joint venture with WellStreet and are now called Piedmont Urgent Care by WellStreet. Under the partnership, operations shifted to WellStreet for its unique expertise in delivering urgent care with proven customer service, clinical quality, employee satisfaction and financial results. For Piedmont staff, rounding to PUC locations have ended.

Nurse Residency Program Welcome New Cohort, Celebrates Graduating Cohort

Piedmont Columbus Regional recently welcomed 46 newlylicensed registered nurses into its nurse residency program. The yearlong program focuses on supporting new RNs as they transition from



advanced beginner to competent clinical professionals. If you see the new nurses in their white-and-orange Piedmont badges, please stop and say hello and ask if they need anything.

We also recently celebrated 47 RNs from who completed their first year of nursing.

They completed the program by attending monthly sessions and participating in Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) group projects within our organization, and presented them to leadership.

Gil Gomez, DO, a former resident in the Jack Hughston Memorial Hospital Residency program is joining the Hughston Clinic team. Before coming to Hughston, Dr. Gomez received his Bachelor of Science degree from College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA where he played football and baseball for the Holy Cross Crusaders. He also worked on his Master's in Science, Sports and Fitness from University of Central Florida in Orlando where he played for the UCF Knights Baseball Team. He received his Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine from



Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine in Suwanee, GA. Most recently, Dr. Gomez completed a one-year AO Orthopaedic Spine Surgery fellowship at Augusta University Medical Center in Augusta, GA.

During his residency, Dr. Gomez served as the Resident director and President of

the Resident American Osteopathic Academy of Orthopaedics. He also served as the Education Representative for the Osteopathic Medical Network of Excellence and he was a member of the Graduate Medical Education Committee. He provided team coverage for Kendrick High School and Columbus High School football programs, and covered the Columbus Cottonmouths of the Southern Professional Hockey League. Dr. Gomez has interests in research in various topics to include bone graft substitutes for cervical discectomy and fusion with recent work "Clinical and radiographic outcomes using third-generation bioactive glass as a bone graft substitute for multi-level anterior cervical discectomy and fusion: a retrospective case series study," being published in the June 2021 issue of the *Journal of Spine Surgery*.

A board-certified orthopaedic surgeon, he is a member of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons and AO Spine North America. He specializes in orthopaedic spinal surgery with an emphasis on minimally invasive techniques, cervical trauma, and the newest techniques in complex spine surgery. He enjoys spending time with his wife and 3 children, being outdoors and anything sports related. He is passionate about his patients with the goal of finding the best nonoperative or surgical options to obtain the most durable solution for an improved quality of life.

Saturday Morning Injury Clinic

The Hughston Foundation sponsors the Hughston Saturday Morning Injury Clinic through November 5. Every Saturday morning during the fall sports season, the Hughston sports medicine team, composed of clinic physicians, residents, athletic trainers, and physical therapists from Hughston come together at the Hughston Clinic to examine high school athletes injured during Friday



night games. This means that no athlete has to pass an anxious weekend awaiting treatment. The healthcare professionals offer on-site diagnoses and treatment plans as well as education on injury management to the athlete and their guardians. These unique Saturday morning sports injury clinics run from August to November. For more than a decade, the members of the Hughston sports medicine team have treated thousands of high school athletes from the West Georgia and East Alabama region who participate in a variety of sports.

Summer Student Research Symposium at Mercer Medical School

Hughston Foundation researchers worked with Mercer medical students during their summer rotations. At the end of the term, the medical students completed poster presentations at Mercer's Summer Student Research Symposium. The Hughston Foundation's staff assisted the research teams with editing and layout of the posters. J. Kenneth Burkus, MD, of the Hughston Foundation Research Committee,

organized the Hughston program that matched Mercer students with Hughston researchers and guided the students while completing the research and presentations.

At the symposium, 3 judges from Mercer faculty ranked the 23 posters and presentations based on 5 categories: poster content, appearance, and organization, as well as presentation flow and a lightening round. Each category carried 10 possible points. Those who achieved the 3 top scores received awards based on the overall score out of 50 possible points and the 4th to 6th best scores were given an honorable mention. Poster subjects included academic, bench, population health and clinical. Mercer professor, Emily McMackin, PhD, presented the awards.


Free CME at Hughston Grand Rounds


